

# ***Ride the TAVI Van into History –*** **VISIT HISTORIC TRENTON**

The Allentown Village Initiative (TAVI) is considering sponsoring a day trip into our state capitol sometime in the fall to experience a number of Trenton’s most historic sites, with a break for lunch at one of its most renowned restaurants. A 15-passenger van would pick up participants in Allentown in the morning, transport them to each location in Trenton, then return them to Allentown in late-afternoon. The tour is expected to take approximately 6 hours.



**The proposed historic stops include** the New Jersey State House – the oldest Statehouse in continuous use in the U.S., the Old Barracks -- the last surviving colonial barracks in New Jersey, the 1719 home of the City’s founder – the William Trent House, and St. Michael’s Episcopal Church -- used by the British as a hospital during the Battle of Trenton, and the final resting place of David Brearley, an Allentown attorney who went on to become a confidant of George Washington, an author of the U.S. Constitution and New Jersey’s first chief justice.

**The price of the tour is anticipated to be approximately \$30 per person** (assuming 15 participants) and is exclusive of lunch at Trenton’s iconic Blue Danube Restaurant. The Blue Danube features Continental and Eastern European cuisine with entrees ranging from \$15 to \$25.
